The subsequent possession allowed Cannon to melt the clock down to six seconds before the Vikings got the ball back. Community tried a trick play but didn’t get it past midfield before time ran out.

Cannon got the ball down to the Providence 21 on their next drive, but came up empty after a low snap caused a field goal attempt by Linstead to sail wide of the goal posts.
Providence got the ball back and marched it up the field. A big personal foul penalty by Cannon kept the drive alive and Providence scored midway through the second quarter with Lamb throwing to Kenan Wilson for 19 yards and a touchdown as Providence stretched their lead 21-7.
Cannon, in a hurry-up offense, took the ball down to the Providence 22 and with time running out. Linstead nailed a 33-yard field goal to make it 21-10 at half.
Cannon was able to cut into the lead with a big play with a little under five minutes remaining in the third. On fourth down, Will Russell made a diving catch in the end zone on the end of a 31-yard pass as Cannon trailed 21-17
The dagger came in the fourth quarter on another misdirection play. Will Lamb connected with Jacob Meier on a 27-yard touchdown pass to move up 28-17.
Providence was able to run out the clock on their next possession and take the win back home to Murfreesboro.
Cannon now falls to 1-1 on the season. Friday night will be a trip to Byrdstown and a meeting with the
